BACKGROUND

What Importance do Seafarers Play in Our Lives?

Have you ever stopped to reflect upon the ease with which we have access to our favorite morning coffee from Brazil, grapes from Chile, or wheat from Turkey? What about our prescription medicine produced in Germany or the gasoline that fuels our cars made with crude oil from Saudi Arabia? 90% of global trade is moved by sea and it is our fellow seafarers who work tirelessly to transport this cargo to and from the world's 6,000 ports, including the 360 seaports that line our U.S. coasts.

Why Should Seafarers Be Considered Essential Workers?

Due to the risk that the current pandemic imposes on human life, essential workers are the men and women whose jobs help protect our wellbeing, safety, and access to basic needs. While much of the world has come to a halt, seafarers continue to deliver products essential for survival to our shores (vaccines, face masks, hygiene items, staple food items). Pope Francis also stresses that, "without the people of the sea, many parts of the world would starve."

What are the Risks that Seafarers Face at Sea?

Seafarers contend with turbulent seas made worse by climate change, modernday piracy, long and grueling workdays, constant exposure to the elements, and lack of medical attention while aboard a vessel. Pope Francis describes their occupation as one of the most dangerous in the world. Those who work on vessels are also at risk for labor exploitation, which at times rises to the level of human trafficking









BACKGROUND

What is the Church Doing to Support Seafarers?

Stella Maris, founded by the Catholic Church, is the largest global maritime ministry serving seafarers, fishers, and family members in the world. In the U.S. Stella Maris is present in 53 maritime ports in 26 states and in 48 dioceses. Port chaplains and lay volunteers minister to seafarers by offering pastoral care, friendship, transportation to purchase basic needs, Internet connection/phone cards to communicate with family members, and more. In addition to offering welcome on ship visits, Stella Maris staff assists seafarers in distress, whether due to exploitative working conditions or long periods of isolation on board the vessel.

Apostleship of the Sea of the United States of America (AOS-USA) is the official professional association of the Catholic Port Chaplains, Mariners, and Cruise Ship Priests. AOS-USA runs the Cruise Ship Priest Program with 500 priests from around the world serving on board over 650 cruises each year.

During the pandemic, AOS-USA and Stella Maris chaplains and volunteers have worked tirelessly to find ways to minister despite seafarers' inability to disembark at port. Many are offering "virtual chaplaincy" to lend a listening ear via email or







Facebook. Others are running errands and preparing care packages for seafarers in need of basic necessities such as cleaning wipes, and fresh water. AOS-USA also provides pastoral care and support for cruise personnel online and via phone, as well as access to the Holy Mass.

How Can I Help Our Brothers and Sisters at Sea?

The resources in this booklet will help you to elevate the visibility of the seafarers as key essential workers! They will help you to advocate for seafarers through prayer, education, and action:

- The Prayers and intercessions allow us to come together in community to ask God to fortify our commitment toward seafarers.
- The bulletin inserts, social media messaging, and resources increase community awareness about seafarers' role in our lives and the impact of the pandemic on their safety and wellbeing.
- The call to action is to urge major retailers like Kroger to better improve their policies and procedures to protect workers. Such forms of advocacy help us to build protective factors for workers.

Coalition of Organizations and Ministries Promoting the Abolition of Slavery at Sea (COMPASS)

According to the <u>NATIONAL OCEANIC AND ATMOSPHERIC ADMINISTRATION</u>, the US Imports 90% of its seafood, and tens of thousands of people are exploited at every link in the seafood harvesting and production chain:

- Abusive Recruitment: With little to no alternative, vulnerable people are deceived and forced/kidnapped into jobs that become trafficking situations.
- Slavery at Sea: Once at sea, workers endure inhumane working hours and
 are compelled to labor under threatening conditions, including extreme and
 reckless exposure to danger and the elements, while being kept on the verge
 of starvation. Beatings and torture are routinely used to ensure submission.
 The cost of noncompliance can be death.
- Exploitation on Land: Conditions of slavery permeate seafood processing plants, and this seafood ends up on our plates.

COMPASS is a global program that strengthens coordination, capacity, and worldwide collaboration on the Catholic response to trafficking; especially in its ministries at sea and ports. COMPASS in collaboration with Stella Maris, is a key leader in the Catholic struggle against human trafficking in the United States.

During Lent many Catholics eat fish and abstain from meat to be in greater solidarity with those in need. The Vatican has announced that it will "slave proof" its supply chain, and many major coporations are following its lead.

Catholics want slave-free seafood and will be vigilant about this as we observe Lent and throughout the year.

Kroger, we acknowledge your efforts in the past few years to begin cleaning up your seafood supply chain. However, we urge you to enhance traceability and transparency efforts in your supply chains to inform the public of your progress. Along with stating
